So you want to go Fishing: first you must have an Ontario Outdoors Card (\$ 8.57 +hst) then purchase a fishing licence cost depends on how many fish you want to catch and/or release, also the length: one day, one year etc. No charge for over 65 years or under 18. FREE FISHING WEEK July 2 to 10, 2022 Check www.ontario.ca for complete info.
- 2. So you want to put your Boat in our lake: A Boat Licence (Pleasure Craft Operator Card) is required for any age and any motorized boat. There are some exemptions for children. Check before you operate. Fines can be charged for boating offences. ALWAYS be considerate of other boaters; non-motorized craft (ie.canoes) and remember SPEED destroys docks & shorelines! Check all the particulars at www.boaterexam.com
- 3. So you just got an ATV: now called ORV (Off Road Vehicle)- are permitted on highways (not 400 series) with the operator having a valid driver's license; helmet; be 16+; wear seatbelt if provided and obey the rules of the road. Your passenger must be over 8 years; wear a helmet and seatbelt, if provided. Suggested reading: the Smart Ride Safe Ride handbook. www.mto.gov.on.ca
- 4. You've got the marshmallows ready now light that Fire! But first you need a Fire Permit -for all fires/campfires (small fires for cooking, warmth and recreational purposes). Available at no charge, from the Municipal office or now online (24/7). For other(larger) fires, you must contact the Whitestone Fire and Rescue Service, pre-inspection might be required. On-line fire permit: www.whitestone.ca
- 5. Got the popcorn, nestled in front of the TV, ready for NETFLIX now let's talk WIFI. But not at your cottage...SO borrow a movie or television show from the LIBRARY !!!! - 6. Waiting for an important e-mail message and no WIFI at the Cottage? Never fear, there is free WIFI throughout the Municipality of Whitestone (no password required).

Rentals of greater than 30 days are exempt.

 Please be advised that there is a NOISE Bylaw in effect no amplified sound after 11 p.m.

WATER QUALITY IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF WHITESTONE



Starting in 2020, the Municipality of Whitestone partnered with Georgian Bay Biosphere to coordinate and conduct a 3 year program of Benthic Monitoring on Whitestone Lake. Under the leadership of Dennis Morrison, of the Whitestone Conservation Association, the third year is now being completed. Lake Wah Wash Kesh joined the program

in 2021, now completing its' second year. Lorimer Lake is in the process of their year one program. This program will continue with always three lakes in the Municipality of Whitestone getting tested each year.

ADDITIONAL WATER TESTING – An annual test is conducted by the WCA, under the direction of Dennis Morrison, on the following lakes: Whitestone, Limestone, Lorimer, Fairholme, Taylor, Gooseneck and Simpson. This is done at the end of Summer. If you know of any additional lake that would be interested in receiving these tests, please contact any member of the WCA Executive.

The WCA members are very grateful for the tremendous amount of time and knowledge that Dennis Morrison brings to the water programmes in Whitestone. Our hat goes off to Dennis.

DISCOVERY ROUTES

Whitestone Lake Recreational Trail makes a 2.9 km loop through a diverse mixed forest with towering hemlock and vibrant oak trees. It is a steep climb to the lookout with sections where the trail's surface may be loose. Sturdy footwear is recommended. Please allow 2-3 hours to complete the loop. The forest is a shared resource available for a variety of users. Caution is required during open hunting season from October to December each year. Please respect private property. This trail is considered "easy to moderate".

DIRECTIONS: Off of Hwy 124, take Hwy 520 North towards Ardbeg. Turn left onto Whitestone Lake Road and follow the road straight to North Meadow Cove Road. The parking area and trailhead sign are on the north side of the road. The trail access is approximately 800m from the parking lot.

Nesbitt Trail is a 2.5 km one-way trail named in memory of Ricky Nesbitt, a life-long resident of Ardbeg. The landscape around the trail is characteristic of Georgian Bay ecology with expansive bedrock ridges and significant wildlife habitat features. The trail is on public land and therefore it is a shared resource for a variety of users. Forest harvest operations may be conducted in the area and may alter the landscape. Caution is required during open hunting season from October to December each year. This trail is considered "easy to moderate"

DIRECTIONS: Off of Highway 124, take Highway 520 North towards Ardbeg. Cross over the railway tracks (the Logger's Station House Restaurant on the left) and proceed to Clear Lake Road. Continue on Clear Lake Road to the Nesbitt Trailhead sign on the right. Parking is across the street.





fishable. Here are four reasons why you should naturalize your shoreline:

1. BIODIVERSITY

Did you know that shorelines are called the Ribbon of Life? Roughly 70% of land species and 90% of aquatic species depend on healthy shoreline habitat for nesting, shelter, travel, reproduction and feeding. Healthy shorelines = great fishing!

2. WATER QUALITY

Water run-off from streets, rooftops, and other hard surfaces contain pollutants, sediment, and other contaminants that end up in our lakes, rivers, and streams. Natural shoreline plants slow down the runoff, allowing time for contaminated water to infiltrate the soil and get absorbed by plant roots before entering the lake.

3. EROSION

Plants with deep root systems hold soil together and mitigate the effects of wave, ice, and wind activity to help prevent erosion. Eroding shorelines literally eat away at your lakefront property.

4. PROPERTY VALUE

One algae bloom can lower property value by 30% (estimate by Canadian Real Estate Association). Swimming, fishing, and drinking lake water is prohibited during algal blooms and greatly diminishes the desirability of the lake.

There are a variety of design possibilities and plant combinations to choose from for your natural shoreline based on the conditions at your individual site. Some possibilities include:

- **1.** Indirectly restore your shoreline by creating a no-mow buffer along your shoreline. Over time, suitable plants will fill in the buffer zone.
- **2.** Directly restore your shoreline by planting trees, shrubs, and wildflowers along your shoreline.
- **3.** Remove hardscaped materials (retaining walls, gabion baskets etc.) or soften them with plants.
